SYMETRA TOUR TOURNAMENT RECAP

The Casino Del Sol Golf Classic was held April 15th – 18th. After 54 holes, Ruixin Liu trailed leader Morgane Metraux by six shots. Liu shot a final round 67 to finish at 15-under par. Birdies on the last four holes helped Liu finish at 15-under par and tie with Morgane Metraux who also finished regulation at 15-under par. The two players went to a dramatic two hole playoff, which ended with Liu making birdie on the second playoff hole. Liu earned \$30,000 for her win, and sits in first place in the top 10 on the Symetra Tour's Race for the LPGA card. The Symetra Tour will return to Tucson for the Casino Del Sol Golf Classic next year!

BRING YOUR OWN WATER BOTTLE - HYDRATE AND STAY COOL

The warm spring and summer season is upon us. Just a

friendly reminder to bring your own water bottles or tumblers out to the club. Tumbler cups can be filled with filtered water at our comfort stations. Water, gatorade, and other beverages are sold in the Wildcat's Grille and by the #1 tee at the turn. Also, a beverage cart is out on the course with drinks, snacks, and pre-made sandwiches. Our golf carts have a cooler available to keep drinks cold during the round. The golf shop sells tumblers to keep ice and water chilled during your round. In addition, the shop also stocks cooling towels that will retain moisture. Wrap a cooling towel around your neck to cool your body temp. Prepare yourself for your round by drinking plenty of water the day before your round, and the morning of.

On Monday, April 5th, Gail Schuler aced #15 with a 9 iron from 129 yards.

On Friday, April 9th, Scott Myers aced #15 with a 9 iron from 134 yards.

On Monday, April 12th, Bruce Petway aced #15 with a 7 iron from 135 yards.

GOLF TIP OF THE MONTH: FIXING YOUR SLICE

The slice is one of the most common swing faults. Check your grip pressure and set up with a relaxed grip. Your grip position should show two to three knuckles when you look

down at your left hand. Ball position should be forward, but not too far forward. If the ball is too far forward in your stance, your shoulders will open up too much and cause a slice. Drop a club parallel to your toes and see if the shaft is parallel to your target line. The club usually points too far left

of the target for slicers, causing the shoulders to misalign to the left. The clubface should be square and aimed down your target line at address. Swing out more toward one o'clock or right field. Slicers try to pull their ball to hit their target, but the clubface will be open when you pull in to cause the slice.
